# Achoo! Maciek Jozefowicz: A Quirky and Charismatic Conductor


### Early Life and Musical Beginnings





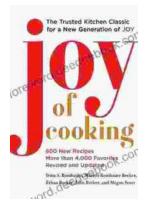
