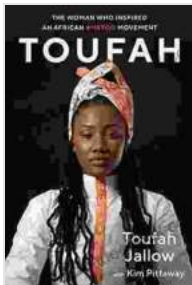

Uyinene Mrwetyana's story is a tragedy, but it is also a story of hope. Her courage and resilience inspired a movement that is changing the world. We must never forget her.

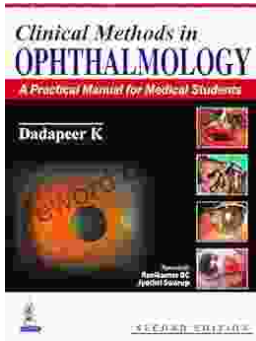
